

2024 Per capita is a set amount of money (apportionment) per member that congregations pay to the larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Every Presbyterian shares in the benefit of the PC(USA)'s system of government, so every Presbyterian is asked to share the expenses associated with coordinating and performing the functions of that system:

Detroit Presbytery	\$ 22.85
Synod	3.25
General Assembly	<u>\$9.80</u>
Total	\$ 35.90

Per capita exists as a way for all Presbyterians to share costs that belong to the whole church, to give meaning to the interdependent nature of Presbyterian polity. *Per capita is part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together.* It exists to allow the whole church to share equitably in those things that make us Presbyterian. The total 2024 per capita apportionment for St. Timothy is \$2,082.20.

The **2024 Initial Offering Envelope** is designed to allow every member the opportunity to donate funds to help defray the cost of our 2024 weekly envelopes. Regular use of these envelopes is important for the support St. Timothy's programs and mission.


